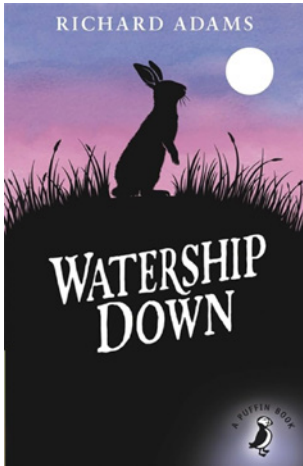
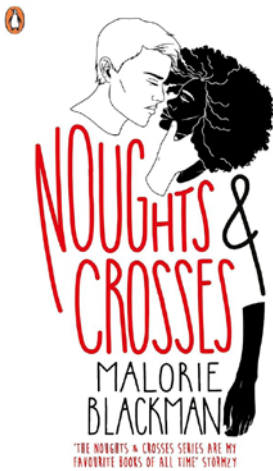

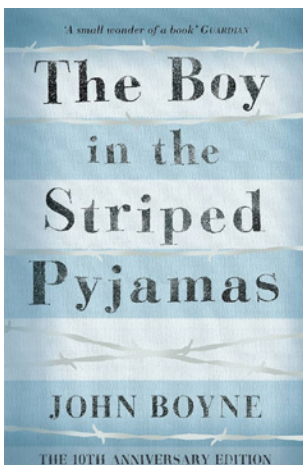
Richard Adams – Watership Down

Follow a group of courageous rabbits as they escape their warren and embark on a perilous journey to find a new home, encountering dangers and forming unbreakable bonds.



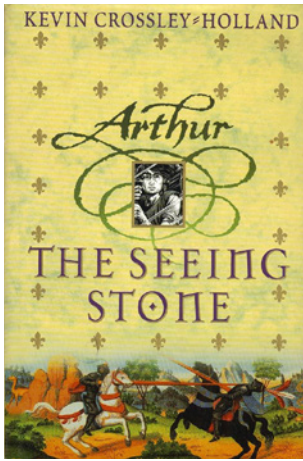
Malorie Blackman – Noughts and Crosses

In a world divided by race and power, Sephy and Callum navigate a forbidden friendship that challenges societal norms and explores themes of prejudice and injustice.



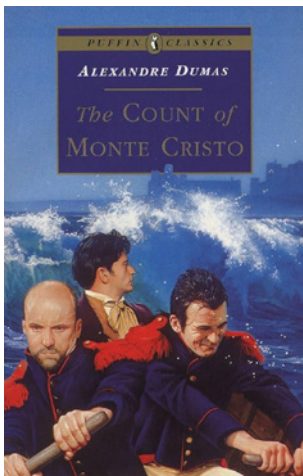
John Boyne – The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas

Set in medieval England, this Arthurian tale follows a young boy named Arthur as he discovers his destiny through visions in a magical seeing stone.



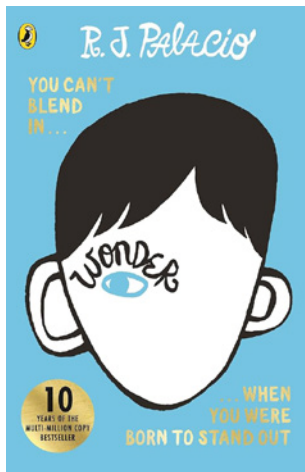
Alexandre Dumas – The Count of Monte Cristo (Puffin Edition)

Suddenly trapped in a town where everyone over the age of 15 has disappeared, a group of teens must confront supernatural forces, develop powers, and form alliances to survive.



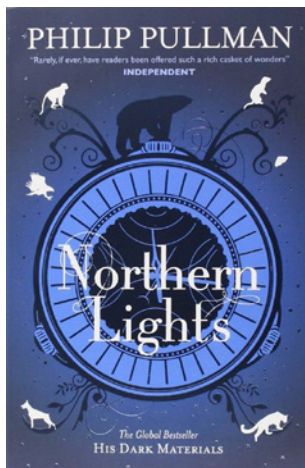
R.J. Palacio – Wonder

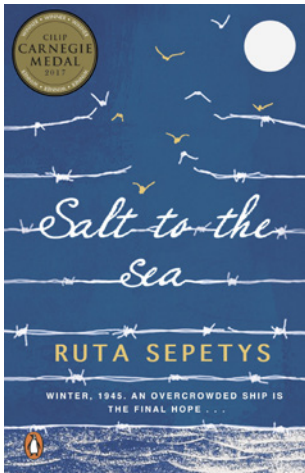
Christopher Paolini – Eragon

Join Eragon, a farm boy who discovers a dragon egg, on an epic quest filled with magic, destiny, and the battle against an evil empire.



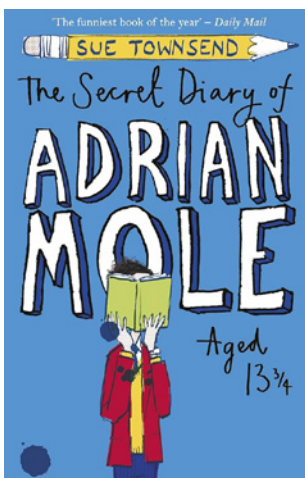
Philip Pullman – Northern Lights
