A poor and tired old shoemaker receives nocturnal help from some elves, whom he rewards by making little clothes and boots for them.

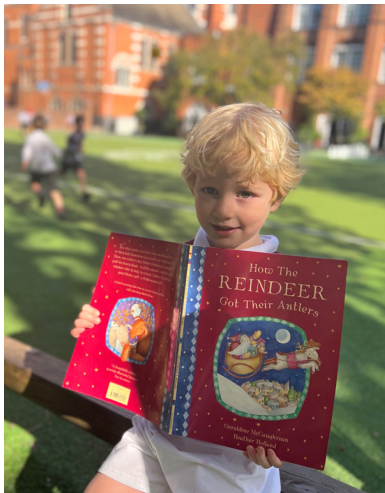
A story of goodness following goodness, this edition has lift-up flaps to charm and entertain.

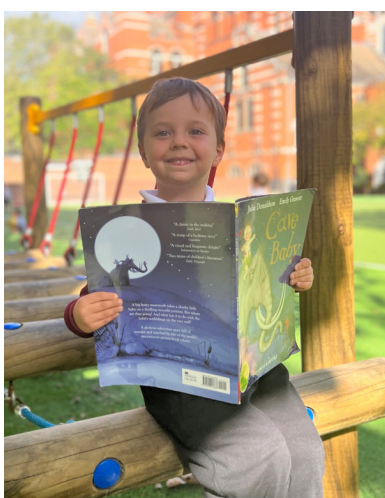
A great fun story, and great for teaching little boys to subtract.
