

Reception (Age 4-5)

Easy Learning Flashcards

Boys who don't learn times tables by heart can struggle with numbers for a lifetime.

Covering the times tables from 2 to 12, with questions on one side and answers on the back, these cards teach boys both multiplication and division.




Year 1 (Age 5-6)

Hit the Button Maths

An app designed to develop mental maths and calculation skills, covering times tables, square numbers, number bonds, doubling and halving.

Between these topics, boys cover the four operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.



Year 2 (Age 6-7)

BrainBox Maths

A fast-paced and fun memory game, perfect for families to play.


Cards include concepts from bar charts and Venn diagrams to fractions and percentages.

IQ Puzzler Pro



Usborne Maths Puzzles


Wipe-clean cards with maths puzzles, including missing angles, missing symbols and prime numbers. Includes a special pen and a scribble card for workings out.

100 Maddening Mindbending Puzzles


A maddeningly difficult selection of logic problems, maths conundrums and word games: one for maths enthusiasts!

First Steps for Problem Solvers


